




ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS:

- a. Logging operations are from Aug. 15TH through the following spring breakup and only when the ground is dry enough or frozen to prevent rutting. If rutting occurs frozen ground harvesting restrictions may be imposed. Harvesting must be concurrent throughout the sale. Slash must be pulled 25' from the ATV-Snowmobile trails and must be cut to no higher than 2' within 50' of the trails. Beyond 50' of the trails there are no slash height requirements.
- b. In the harvest area, all orange marked trees and all ironwood 1" diameter and larger must be cut regardless of merchantability. Utilization is 100" to a 4" top. Do not cut aspen, pine or spruce. Snags must remain standing unless they are a safety issue for the harvesting operation. Damage to residual regeneration must be minimized and will not be tolerated. Directional felling, minimal processor and forwarder/skidder damage is a must. Pole skidding restricted to a maximum stringer length of 25 feet.
- c. Any trees felled into the wetland areas either within the sale or adjacent to the sale must be pulled back onto high ground before limbing and bucking occurs. No equipment will be allowed to operate within 15' of any wetland areas within or adjacent to the timber sale.
- d. All ATV gates will be closed at the end of each day to keep other vehicles off the ATV trail.
- e. The ATV trail can be used as a logging road, must be kept free of debris and machinery and in safe useable condition during the ATV season (Memorial Day to the following March 15th). Any trail signs removed must be replaced immediately in a position making them effective for their purpose. No decking on the ATV trail & no trees felled onto or across the ATV trail. The trail must be leveled and returned to its original condition & all logging roads to the ATV trail will be bermed off. Bond Money will not be returned until this has been completed to the satisfaction of the County.
- f. All applicable BMP's must be followed during all phases of the sale.
- g. Access is limited to current logging road system. Landing sites must have County Forestry Dept. approval prior to development. All roads and landings must be leveled and free of slash at the end of each harvest season and at sale completion. Logging road vehicle access points must be bermed or install large rocks to close these access points to vehicle traffic at the end of each harvest season and at sale completion. Bond money will not be returned until all trail rehabilitation is completed.
- h. Access to the sale is via the Parish Highlands ATV/Snowmobile trail. This trail must be kept open, snow covered in the winter and is safe useable conditions at all times. "CAUTION" signs will be needed on this ATV/Snowmobile trail.
- i. Any trees felled across the blue paint line must be pulled back onto the County before they are limbed.
- j. All items of the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract also apply.
