



Additional Regulations

- In the Aspen Regeneration area, harvest all Aspen, Balsam Fir, Red/Sugar Maples and White Birch 1" diameter or larger. Harvest all Ironwood. Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. Do not cut any other species including: basswood, yellow birch, cherry, oak, white ash, black ash, hemlock, cedar, tamarack, all spruce, all pine and elm. Any den or nest trees will be left alone in both areas. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. If utilizing whole tree, every 10th tree top above the standard 4" top diameter must remain in the woods on high-dry ground where the tree was felled. **Do NOT cut any trees within 50 feet of the 5 grass openings and do NOT cut within the 5 Green painted Retention Zones.**
- Year-round harvesting is allowed. Harvesting may occur in this sale as long as the ground is frozen or dry to prevent rutting. Additional time restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs. If, in the opinion of the County, excessive damage to the residual stand cannot be avoided by the Contractor, the Contract may be cancelled.
- Following completion of the sale, all logging roads and trails will be returned to their original condition or better. Bond money will not be returned until all road work is completed. No skidding, decking or equipment on the Ski Trail from December through March, except to cross the trail. Every year prior to December 1st, the ski trail must be in as good or better condition and free of debris and equipment. The logging contractor is liable for all ski trail signs and posts.
- No equipment is allowed in the swamps, ephemeral ponds or wet areas adjacent to or within the sale. Any trees felled into the swampy wetlands must be pulled back onto high ground before limbing. All slash must be removed from these wet areas.
- All new roads, trails and landings must have approval of the County prior to construction. BMP's will be enforced on all aspects of the sale.
- All slash must be pulled 25' from the Ski Trail and lopped and scattered not to lie no more than 2' high.
- All items of the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply.
