

DIVE TEAM MEMBER

Oneida County is accepting applications for the Oneida County Dive Team. This position pays \$16.31 per hour plus mileage reimbursement.

Qualified applicants must possess a valid Wisconsin Driver's license, and have the desire and ability to operate in dive rescue response and recovery operations. These operations include night, ice, deep and low visibility dive conditions. Team members are expected to work within the Incident Command System under the direction of an incident commander. Members shall take part in monthly trainings, attend related meetings, and maintain or obtain the appropriate certifications for public safety divers. Applicants must pass an initial medical physical and maintain an annual standard of fitness as prescribed by the Dive Team. **No previous diving experience is required in order to be considered for this position.**

SUMMARY This position is responsible for the protection of life and property through mitigation of incidents involving water rescue and recovery. Direct supervision is received from the Dive Team Leader. Assigned duties are performed in accordance with state statutes, the Policy and Procedures for the Oneida County Public Safety Dive Team, and Emergency Response Diving International (ERDI) Public Safety Dive Standards.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES The following duties are normal for this position.

Respond to calls for service and successfully don dive gear.

Deploy as a public safety diver according to Emergency Response Diving International (ERDI) Standards and Oneida County Dive Team policy.

Respond to calls for service from the public and assist in the mitigation of incidences that involve water rescue and recovery.

Conduct an assessment of an incident scene and rapidly identify the immediate hazards that may affect the Public and Response Personnel.

Any other duties related to the Dive Team assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

Certify and maintain ERDI Public Safety Dive Standards.

Maintain ERDI Public Safety Dive Fitness Standards.

Certify and maintain additional dive standards of night-limited visibility, ice, dry suit, full-face mask, deep, and underwater evidence technician.

Must maintain minimum membership qualifications as outlined in the Bylaws for the Oneida County Dive Team.

Must be familiar with and able to coordinate response activities utilizing Incident Command, Unified Command, and National Incident Management Systems.

Must be able to follow written policy and procedures.

Must maintain at a minimum a Wisconsin "class D" valid driver's license.

LANGUAGE SKILLS Must have good verbal and written communication skills. The ability to record / deliver information, explain procedures, and follow instructions.

REASONING ABILITY The ability to evaluate situations and make good independent decisions based on practices, rules and procedures.
