



ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS:

- Harvest Period:** The sale will be harvested between freeze up and March 15th to minimize damage to advanced regen. If rutting occurs, harvesting will be halted until soil conditions improve and rutting doesn't occur or the contract may be cancelled.
- Harvest Requirements:** The sale will be cut using a fixed head processor. This operator will cut desired trees and fell them in either the direction they plan to go or where they came from to minimize regeneration damage. Short wood forwarding will also be required. Forwarding operators will follow where the processor went. Random driving through the sale to pick up forest products or to return to the landing will not be tolerated. Again, to minimize regeneration damage.
- Do not harvest or damage red oak, pine, hemlock, spruce, aspen or yellow birch.
- Harvest all maple, white birch, ash and balsam fir 1" diameter and larger regardless of merchantability. Harvesting must be concurrent throughout the sale. Stump heights may not exceed 10 inches from the ground.
- If harvesting whole tree, every 10th tree top, the portion above the 4" standard pulpwood stick, must remain in the woods and evenly scattered over the sale area.**
- Current landing sites and short stub roads can be used and improved off of Al Hintz Road. Landing sites must have County Forestry Dep't. approval. No new roads will be allowed. All logging roads and landings must be leveled, free of slash and blocked with a berm or rocks at the end of each harvest season and at the completion of the sale. No decking/piling of forest products or skidding on the Al Hintz Road. No equipment will be allowed to operate in any wetland areas. No slash allowed in any wetlands.
- All slash along the Al Hintz Road must be pulled back within the timber sale tree line. No slash height restrictions.
- GPL:** Operation of equipment and tree felling into the GPL zone is prohibited.
- The Al Hintz Road is used as a snowmobile trail. This portion of the road (trail) must be kept in usable condition at all times. Felling of trees onto or over the road (trail) is prohibited. Parking of equipment on the road or ROW is prohibited. "Logging Ahead" signs must be installed while the harvesting and trucking operations are active on this sale.
- All dead standing trees must be left standing unless they pose a safety hazard to the harvesting operation.
- All provisions of the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract also apply.
