

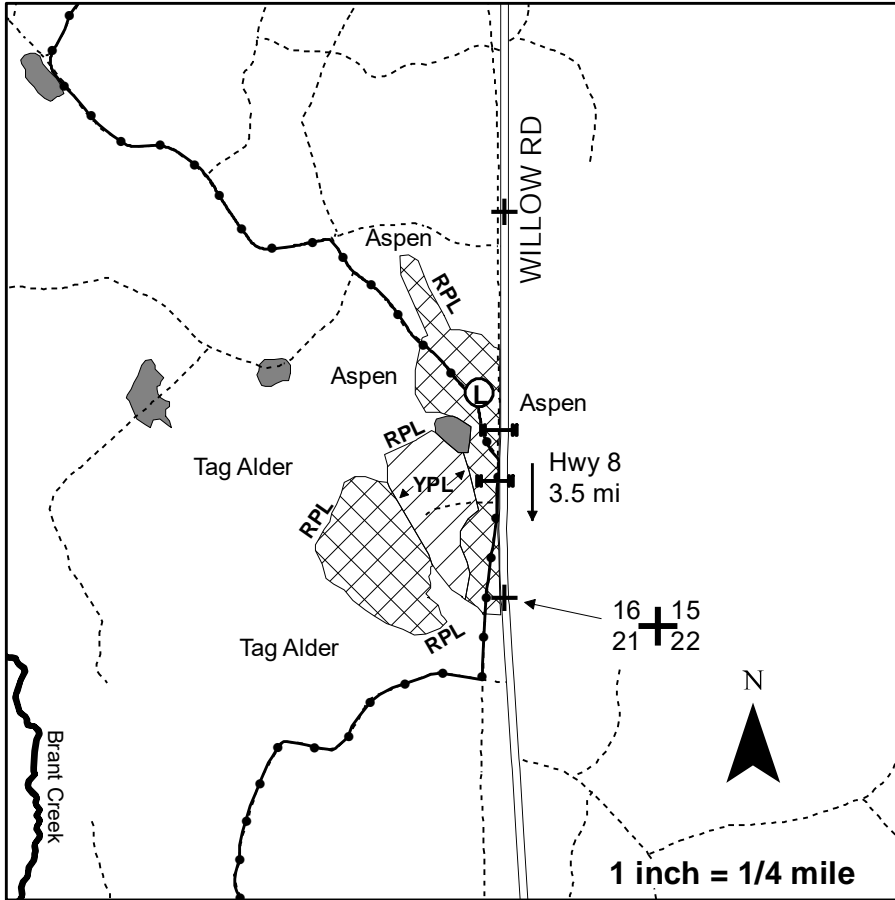

Additional Regulations:

- In the marked thinning area between the snowmobile trail and Willow Rd**, harvest all trees marked with orange paint, all aspen 12" dia or larger and all Ironwood 1" dia or larger. Do not cut any Balsam Fir.
In all other marked thinning areas, harvest all trees marked with orange paint and all Aspen, Balsam Fir and Ironwood 1" dia or larger. In all Marked Thinning areas, as much musclewood shall be cut or run down as possible.
In the clear cut area, harvest all stems >1" DBH except elm, black cherry, cedar, tamarack, spruce and pine. No aspen shall be cut within 50' of the grass opening in any harvest area. Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, every 10th tree top above the 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest area. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard.
- Dry or frozen ground conditions will be required for harvesting and hauling activities. Harvesting activities in the marked thinning areas are limited to July 15 through March 15 (spring breakup) to prevent damage to the residual trees. Time restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs. If, in the opinion of the County, excessive damage to the residual stand cannot be avoided by the Contractor, additional harvesting restrictions will be imposed or the Contract may be cancelled.
- No decking or skidding is permitted on Willow Road or within its ditches. The grass opening may be used as a landing as long as it is leveled and free of slash upon sale completion. All landings and roads must have approval of the County prior to construction. Following completion of the sale, all trails and landings will be returned to their original condition or better. Any new access roads will be bermed off or blocked with boulders at the completion of each harvest season and at completion of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road work is completed.
- Signs shall be posted on Willow Road and on both ends of the snowmobile trail (if trail is active) while harvesting and hauling. If the trail is active it must be kept in safe and operable condition. Trail gates must be closed and locked during periods of sale inactivity. The trail shall be returned to its original condition or better upon completion of the sale.
- No equipment or slash is allowed in the wetland areas adjacent to the sale. Equipment may not be operated within 15 feet of any wetland unless ground is dry or frozen.
- Slash must be pulled back a minimum of 25' from Willow Road and shall be cut to within 2' of the ground in this area. Slash shall also be pulled back a minimum of 10' from the snowmobile trail and cut to within 2' of the ground within 25' of the trail.
- Stump height shall not exceed 10" within the entire sale area.
- All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All applicable BMP's will be followed. Sale Est. AAJ 11/2016
