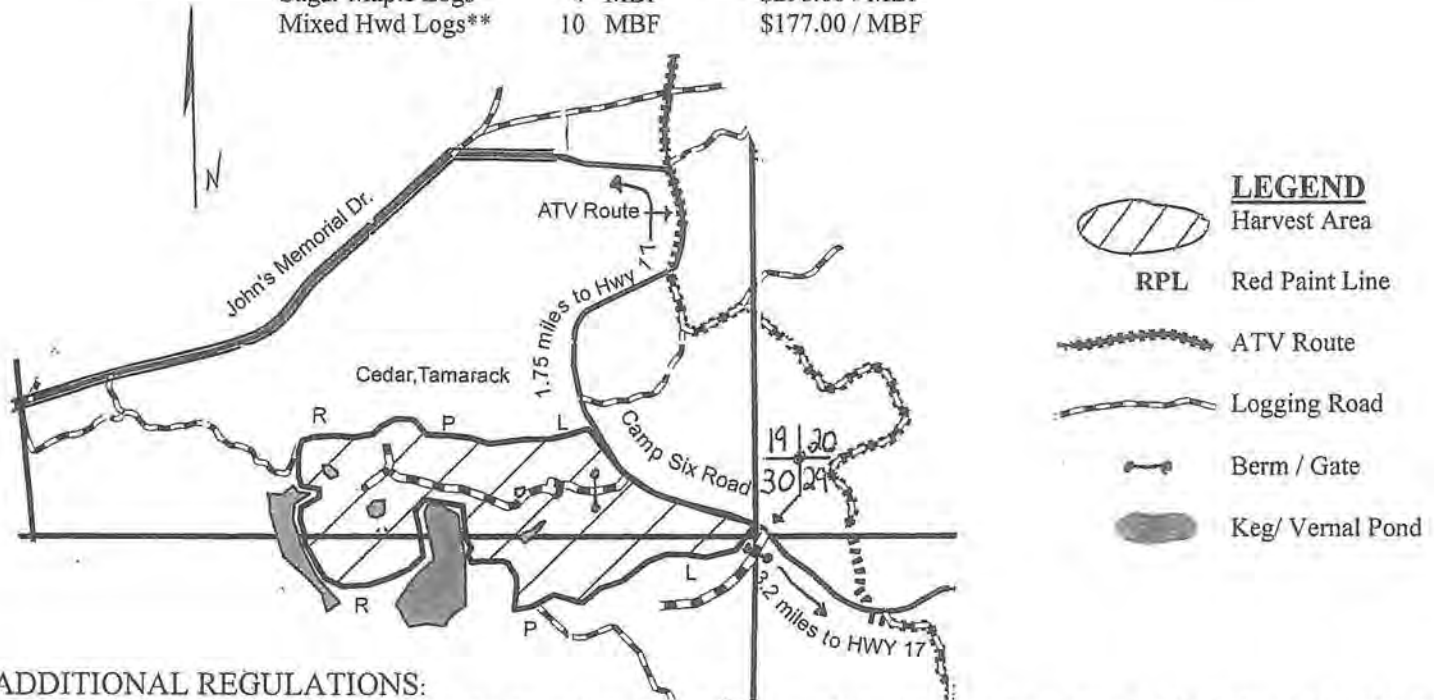

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS:

- Logging operations are restricted to the dates from July. 15TH through the following Spring Break Up, ~March 15 and only when the ground is dry enough or frozen to prevent rutting. If rutting occurs frozen ground harvesting restrictions may be imposed. Slash heights must be 2 ft. or less within 50' of Camp Six Road and must be pulled back 10' from the Road. No other slash height restrictions.
- Within the harvest area all 1" and larger diameter ironwood and balsam fir will be cut and all trees marked with orange marking paint will be harvested regardless of merchantability. Canopy gap areas have been established on this sale and are indicated by purple painted trees. Cut all trees greater than 1" diameter, except red oak, within the gaps including purple painted trees, leaving paint visible on the stump. Snags must remain standing unless they are a safety issue for the harvesting operation. Damage to residual regeneration must be minimized. Utilization is 100" to a 4" top or as bid as stated above for whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, every 10th tree top, the portion above the 4" standard pulpwood stick, must remain in the woods and evenly scattered over the sale area. No whole tree skidding.
- Any trees felled into the wetland areas either within the sale or adjacent to the sale must be pulled back onto high ground before limbing and bucking occurs. No equipment will be allowed to operate in any wet areas within or adjacent to the timber sale.
- Access is limited to current logging road system. Landing sites must have County Forestry Dept approval. All roads and landings must be leveled and free of slash and must be blocked with a berm or rocks at the end of each harvest season and at sale completion. No trees are to be felled onto or across Camp Six Road. Bond money will not be returned until all trail/road rehabilitation is complete.
- The ATV Route can be used as a logging road, must be kept free of debris and machinery and in safe useable condition during the ATV season. Any trail signs removed must be replaced immediately in a position making them effective for their purpose
- All applicable BMP's must be followed during all phases of the sale.
- Access to the sale is from Camp Six Road. "CAUTIONARY" signs will be posted by the contractor on two or more locations on Camp Six Road.
- All items of the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract also apply.
