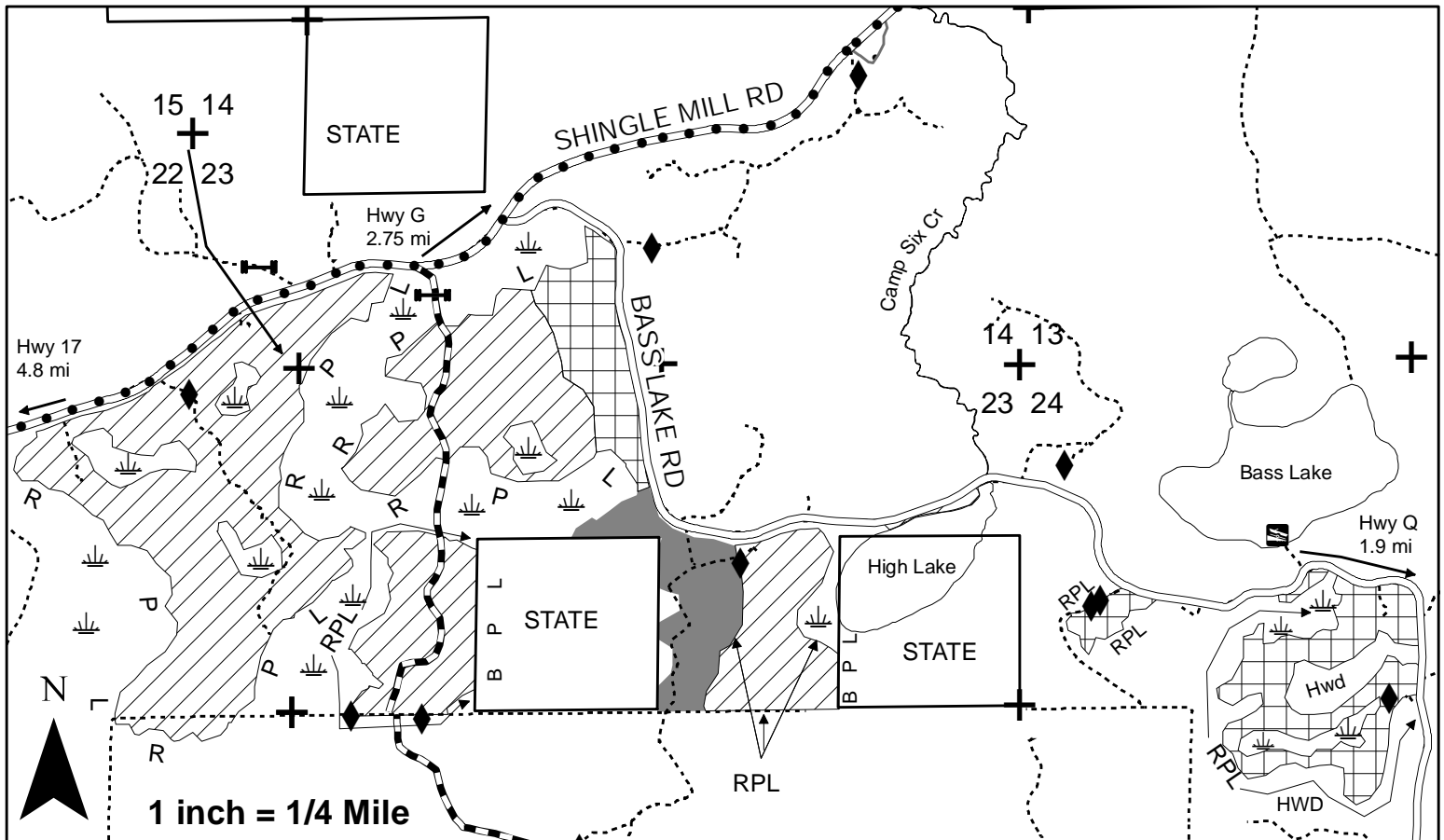

HARVEST REGULATIONS

1. In all harvest areas, harvest ironwood, and balsam fir 1" dia or larger and only those hardwood hemlock trees marked with orange paint. DO NOT HARVEST ASPEN OR WHITE BIRCH 8" DIA OR SMALLER UNLESS MARKED WITH ORANGE PAINT.

Within the purple painted canopy gaps, harvest all trees 1" dia or larger except Red Oak and harvest all purple painted trees. TOPS ARE NOT TO BE LEFT IN THE GAPS.

Green marked trees are to be felled and left intact at the felling site. Do not limb them.

Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree trees must be topped at the felling site and tops forwarded to landing (no whole tree skidding) and every 10th tree top above the 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest area. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard.

2. Dry or frozen ground conditions will be required for harvesting and hauling activities. No harvesting may occur between March 15 (spring breakup) and July 15 in order to prevent damage to the residual stand. Time restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs. If, in the opinion of the County, excessive damage to the residual stand cannot be avoided by the Contractor, additional harvesting restrictions will be imposed or the Contract may be cancelled.

3. The disabled hunter trail must be kept in safe and operable condition at all times. The trail gate must remain closed and locked when no one is on site.

4. Decking on Shingle Mill and Bass Lk roads will only be allowed when the road is dry or frozen to prevent damage. It is the contractors responsibility to repair any damage to these roads including graveling if required. Decking will be allowed along the roads as long as piles are kept far enough off the road so as not to cause a hazard to motor vehicle travel. All landings and roads must have approval of the County prior to construction. At the end of each harvest season and upon completion of the sale, all roads, trails and landings will be returned to their original condition or better. Any new access roads or existing ones which were blocked prior to sale startup will be bermed off or blocked with boulders at the completion of each harvest season and at completion of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road work is completed.

5. Cautionary signage shall be posted on Shingle Mill and Bass Lake Road while harvesting and hauling.

6. No slash may be left in the wetland areas within or adjacent to the sale. Equipment may not be operated within 15 feet of any wetland unless ground is dry or frozen.

7. No equipment or slash is permitted within the reserve area. Any trees felled across the blue paint lines must be pulled back into the sale before limbing and bucking. All slash must be cut to less than 2' high within 25' of Shingle Mill and Bass Lake Roads. All slash must be pulled 10' from Shingle Mill Road, Bass Lake Road and the Disabled Hunter Trail edges.

8. Stump height shall not exceed 10" within the entire sale area.

9. All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All applicable BMP's will be followed.
