

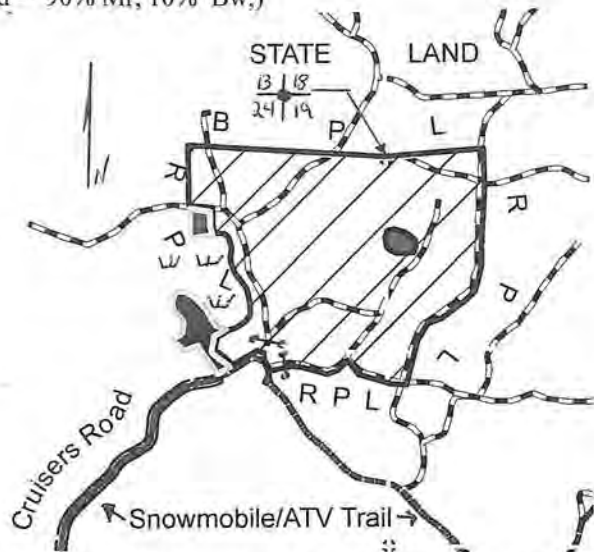

### ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS

- Harvest Requirements:** Logging operations are allowed from July 15th (oak wilt restrictions) to the following March 15<sup>th</sup> (spring break up) as long as the ground is sufficiently dry or frozen to prevent rutting. Tree length skidding is permitted only if residual damage does not occur. Damage to residual trees will not be tolerated. Harvesting must be concurrent throughout the sale. Stump heights may not exceed 10 inches from the ground.
- Harvest area:** Harvest all trees 1" and larger except Pine, Hemlock, Cherry, Bur Oak, and trees marked with green paint.
- Utilization is 100" stick to a 4" top or as bid. If harvesting whole tree, 1 in 10 tops above the standard 4" top must be left on site and evenly scattered throughout the sale.
- All Roads and landings must have permission of the County prior to construction and must be graded flat at the end of each harvest season and at the end of the sale. Access roads must be rocked or bermed closed at the end of each harvest season and at the end of the sale. No new roads. Bond money will not be returned until all road work is completed.
- No equipment may be operated within 15' of any wetland or vernal pond unless the ground is frozen. No slash is permitted in the wetland areas within or adjacent to the sale. No equipment is allowed to operate within the GTR areas.
- NOTE:** Cruisers Road is a snowmobile trail during the winter and an ATV trail the rest of the year. The snowmobile trail must be kept snow covered during the snowmobile season. This trail must remain free of equipment and in a safe usable condition at all times. Wood decked along the trail must be far enough off the road as to not create a hazard to motor vehicles. Caution signs must be posted on Cruisers Road/trail when active harvesting occurs.
- BMP's must be followed on all aspects of the sale. All dead standing trees must be left standing unless they pose a safety hazard to the harvesting operation.
- All terms of the County Timber Sale Contract also apply.
