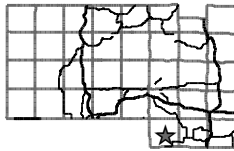


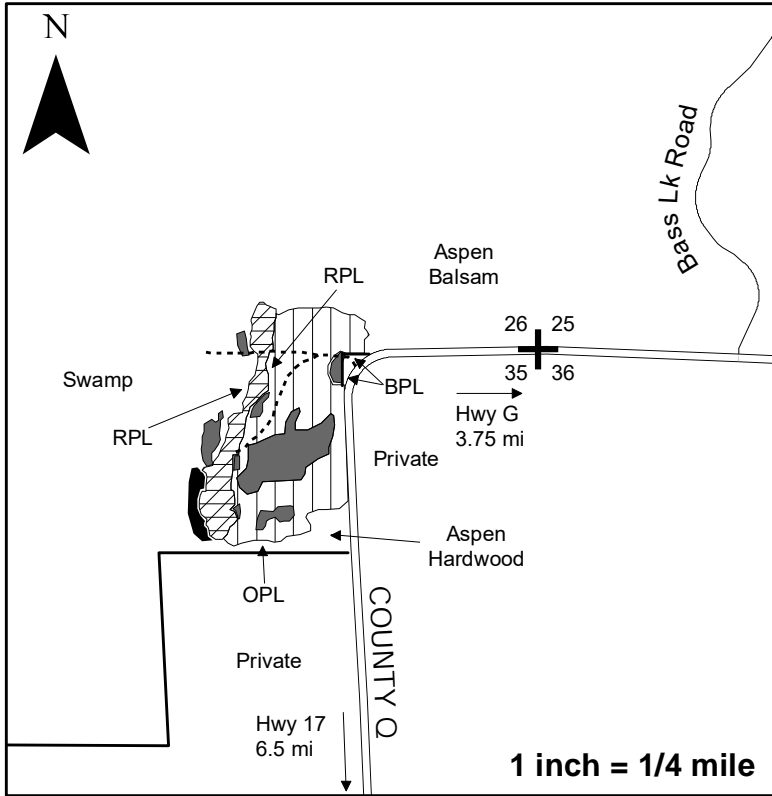

### Additional Regulations:

- In the strip thinning area, **where rows are indistinct**, (generally the southern half of the sale) harvest all trees >1" within designated cut strips.  
 In the strip thinning area, **where rows are distinct**, (generally the northern half of the sale) cut one row and leave two. Rows run in a general North-South direction.  
 Cut strips shall be 15 feet wide, leaving 30-40 ft uncut strips. The first tree in each strip is designated by three orange bands. The north end of the strip thinning area is bounded by aspen and fir and is not marked with paint of any kind.  
 In the marked thinning area, cut all Balsam Fir and Red Maple >1" and trees marked with yellow paint. The marked thinning area is surrounded by red paint.
- Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, every 10th tree top above the 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest area. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard.
- Logging and hauling operations are allowed year round as long as the ground is dry or frozen to prevent rutting. No equipment is allowed within 15 feet of the wetland areas adjacent to and within the sale unless ground is dry or frozen.
- Landowner permission will be required to access the sale from the Northeast, as the old logging road crosses private land. A small stub road may be necessary to properly access the southern side of the sale.
- All pine cut between April 1 and August 15 must be skidded and hauled within two weeks of cutting. Time restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods, on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs. If, in the opinion of the County, excessive damage to the residual stand cannot be avoided by the Contractor, additional harvesting restrictions will be imposed or the Contract may be cancelled.
- All landings and roads must have approval of the County prior to construction. Following completion of the sale, all trails and landings will be returned to their original condition or better. Any new access roads will be bermed off or blocked with boulders at the completion of each harvest season and at completion of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road work is completed.
- Signs shall be posted on Highway Q while harvesting and hauling. No skidding or decking on Hwy Q or within its ditches.
- Slash must be pulled back a minimum of 25' from County Highway Q right-of-way. Any slash within 50' of Highway Q must be cut to a height of no more than two feet above the ground. Stump height shall not exceed 10". No slash may be left within the wetland areas. No slash is to be left across the blue paint line and any trees felled across the blue line must be pulled back into the sale before limbing and bucking.
- All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All applicable BMP's will be followed. Sale Est. AAJ 8/16

NOTE: Heterobasidion Root Disease preventative spraying requirements will be implemented if the disease is found in Oneida County or an adjacent county prior to or during the period of this contract. See Timber Sale Contract for details.
