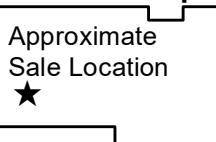

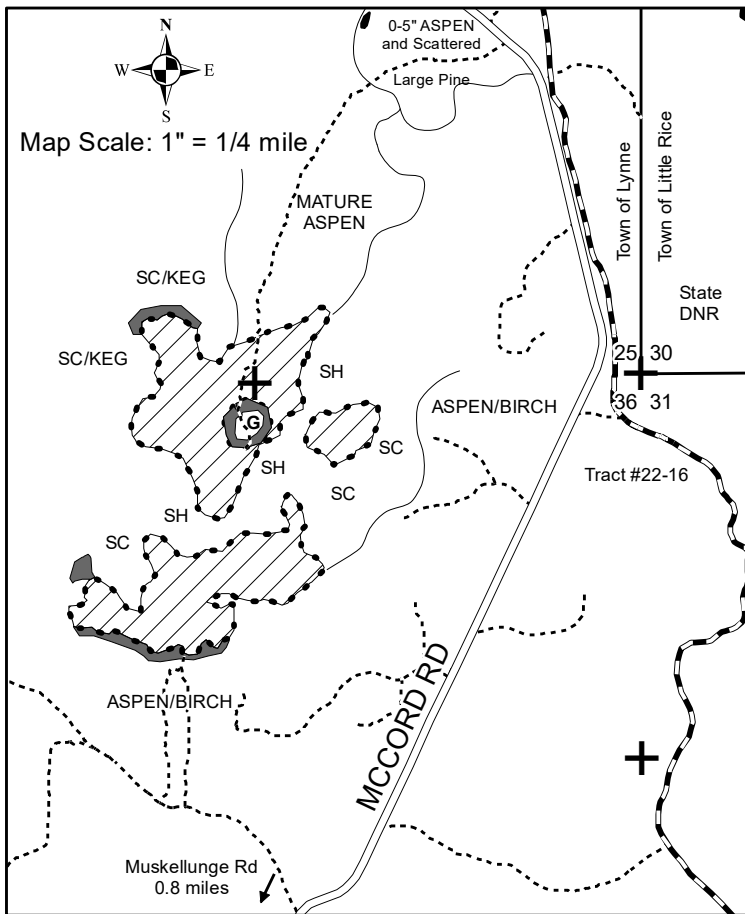

### Additional Regulations:

- In the **Harvest Areas** harvest all 1" dia. at breast height (DBH) and larger aspen, white birch, ironwood, balsam fir, sugar maple, and red maple and only White Spruce 12" DBH up to 18" DBH. Leave all cherry, yellow birch, elm, pine, oak, cedar and white spruce smaller than 12" DBH and larger than 18" DBH. Do not cut Aspen within 50 ft of grass opening to minimize sprouting in the opening. Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, 1 in 10 tops above the standard 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest areas. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. Slash is to be cut or run down to no higher than 2 ft off the ground.
- Logging operations, including road work, may take place only when the ground is sufficiently dry or frozen to prevent rutting. Access to the south part of the sale may be made through the aspen/birch stand to the south. Access to the east island will require crossing a short distance of lowland which will require timber mats, corduroy or brush mats if the ground is not frozen. All material placed in this wetland for crossing that didn't originate in the wetland must be removed to the extent possible and placed on high ground.
- No equipment is allowed in the swampy, tag alder, wet-keg areas adjacent to or within the sale except when ground is frozen or on timber mats, corduroy or brush mats.
- All trails and landings must have approval of the County prior to construction. Following completion of the sale, all trails will be returned to their original condition or better. All access roads will be rocked or bermed off at the end of each harvest season and at the end of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road work is completed.
- The entire sale is bounded by wetlands and wetland forest. No slash is to be left in any of these areas unless it is from trees harvested in the wetland areas.
- Stump height may not exceed 10".
- No harvesting within reserve areas. No equipment or slash will be allowed in these areas except for a single access point from the southern harvest area.
- All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All applicable BMP's will be followed.
