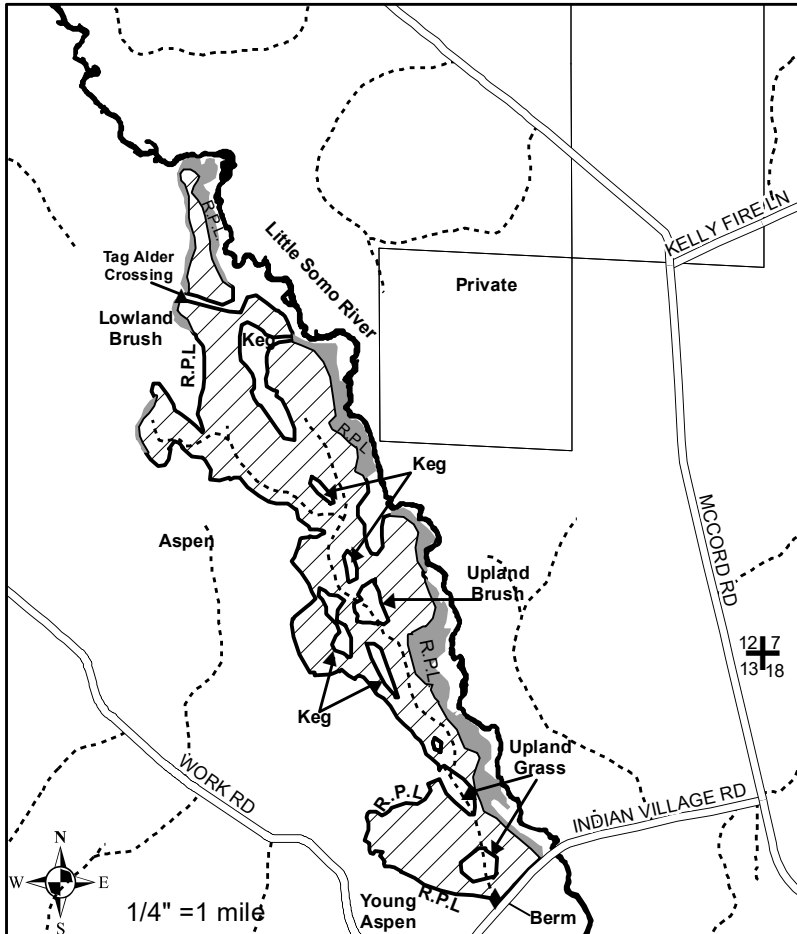

**Additional Regulations:**

- Harvest all 1" dbh (diameter at breast height) and larger aspen, white birch, basswood, balsam fir, sugar maple, red maple, white ash, black ash and only those white spruce between 12" and 18" DBH. Leave all cherry, yellow birch, elm, spruce smaller than 12" and larger than 18" DBH, pine, oak and cedar. Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, 1 in 10 tops above the standard 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest areas. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. Do not cut aspen within 50' of grass/brush openings in order to minimize sprouting in the openings.
- Logging operations, including road work, may take place only when the ground is sufficiently dry or frozen to prevent rutting. Due to drainage crossings, frozen ground and/or timber mats will be required to cross.
- No equipment is allowed in the swampy, tag alder, wet-keg areas adjacent to or within the sale except for the crossing to the north island. If any slash is brought in for floatation in the drainage crossings from upland areas, that slash must be removed.
- All trails and landings must have approval of the County prior to construction. Following completion of the sale, all trails will be returned to their original condition or better. All access roads will be rocked or bermed off at the end of each harvest season and at the end of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road work is completed. Existing grassy openings within the sale may be used for landings. Grassy openings must be leveled and clear of debris upon completion of sale operations.
- All slash must be cut to less than 2 ft high within 50 ft of Indian Village Rd and must be pulled back 25 ft from the road. Skidding or decking on Indian Village Rd may be allowed with permission from the town of Lynne. Wood decked along the road must be far enough off the road so as not to create a hazard to motor vehicles. Any damage to the road will be repaired by the contractor including grading and graveling if necessary. Cautionary signs on Indian Village and McCord Rd may be needed.
- Stump height may not exceed 10".
- No harvesting within reserve areas. No equipment or slash will be allowed in these areas.
- All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All applicable BMP's will be followed.
