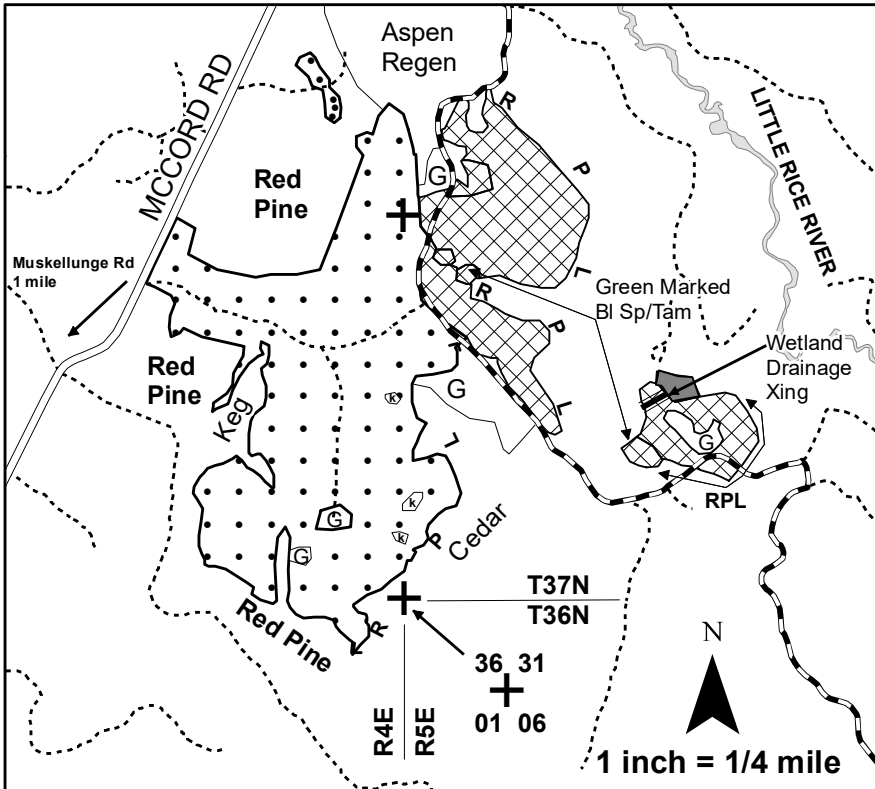

**Additional Regulations:**

1. **In the Marked Hardwood Area**, harvest all trees marked with orange paint along with all Balsam Fir and Ironwood 1" diameter or larger. Do not cut any spruce west of the ATV/Snowmobile trail. **FIXED HEAD HARVESTER OR HAND CUTTING ONLY** in order to minimize damage to hardwood regeneration. To the extent possible, trees should be felled in the track of the harvester. No ground skidding (cable or grapple). If excessive damage to hardwood regeneration or residual trees (in the opinion of the County) occurs, the Contract may be cancelled.

**In the Aspen/Spruce Regen Area**, harvest all aspen, maple, white birch, ash 8" dbh and larger, balsam fir and black spruce and tamarack not marked green. Also, harvest only those white spruce 12" dbh to 18" dbh. Frozen ground conditions or extremely dry conditions will be required in parts of these areas. Disregard orange marked trees on the east side of the ATV/Snowmobile trail. These trees are to be cut along with above described trees. There is a wetland drainage crossing on the north side of this area. Timber mats, corduroy or brush mats will be required to cross this area. All material placed in the wetland must be removed when harvesting is complete. No aspen shall be cut within 50' of the grass openings in any harvest areas. No equipment allowed in Retention Area. Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, every 10th tree top above the 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest area. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard.

2. Dry or frozen ground conditions will be required for harvesting and hauling activities in both areas. Harvesting activities in the marked thinning areas are limited to July 15 through March 15 (spring breakup) for Oak Wilt prevention and to prevent damage to the residual trees. Time restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs. If, in the opinion of the County, excessive damage to the residual stand cannot be avoided by the Contractor, additional harvesting restrictions will be imposed or the Contract may be cancelled.

3. No new roads will be permitted. Existing roads may be opened and improved and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. The ATV/Snowmobile trail may be used for decking and trucking. The trail must be kept in a safe, useable condition at all times. Wood decked on the trail must be kept far enough off the trail surface so as not to cause a safety issue with trail users. The trail through the marked hardwood will be blocked off with berms or rocks at the end of each harvest season and at the end of the sale. All trails will be returned to their original condition or better at the of sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road/landing rehabilitation is complete.

4. Cautionary signs shall be posted by the contractor on the ATV/Snowmobile trail at either end of the sale.

5. No equipment or slash is allowed in the wetland areas within or adjacent to the sale. Equipment may not be operated within 15 feet of any wetland unless ground is dry or frozen.

6. Slash must be pulled back a minimum of 10' from the ATV/Snowmobile trail and must be cut to less than 2' high within 25' of the trail. No slash control beyond the 25' zone is required.

7. All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All applicable BMP's will be followed.
