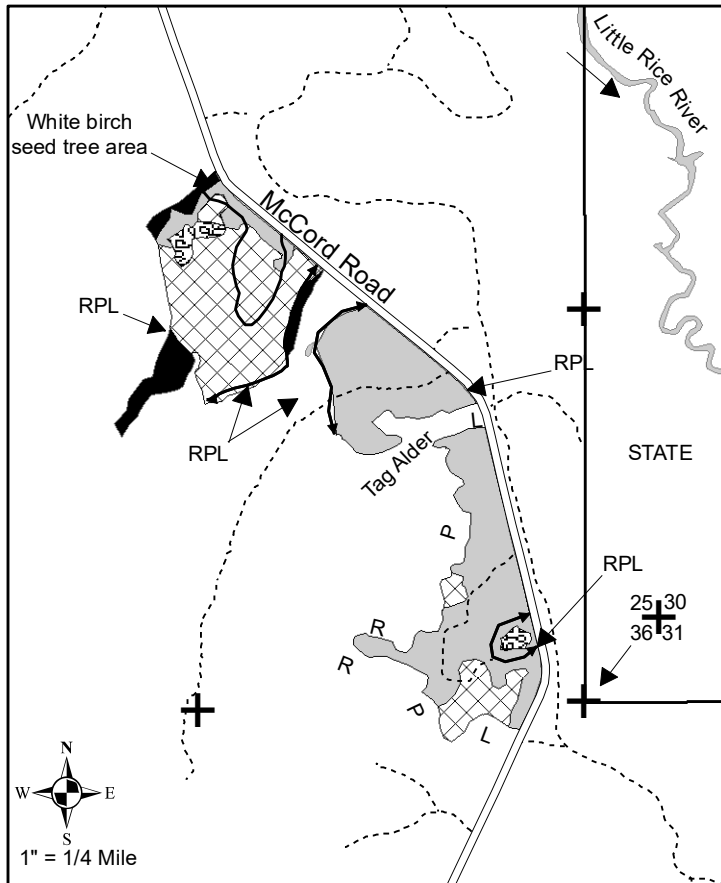

Additional Regulations

1. In the Harvest Areas, harvest all aspen, maple and balsam fir one inch and larger and all merchantable white birch except those marked with green paint. Do not cut spruce, pine, hemlock, cherry, oak or green marked trees. Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting Whole Tree, every 10th tree top above the 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest area. Any den or nest trees shall be left alone. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard.
2. Harvesting must be completed when the ground is sufficiently dry or frozen to prevent rutting. Parts of the sale have relatively wet ground so frozen ground may be required for parts of the sale. Additional time restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs. If, in the opinion of the County, excessive damage to the residual stand cannot be avoided by the Contractor, additional harvesting restrictions will be imposed or the Contract may be cancelled.
3. All landing and road locations must have the County's approval prior to construction. No landings will be permitted in the white birch seed tree area. No skidding or decking on McCord Road or in its ditches without the permission of the Town. Skidding through the regeneration resulting from the previous harvest must be kept to a single trail. Felling of trees into the regeneration must be avoided. Following completion of the sale, all trails will be returned to their original condition or better. Any new roads constructed shall be bermed or blocked with boulders upon completion of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road work is completed.
4. No equipment is allowed in the swampy, wet-keg areas within the sale unless the ground is frozen. No equipment will be permitted within the green tree retention areas or adjacent wetlands. All slash must be removed from these areas. Slash must be cut to no higher than 2' within 50' of town roads and slash must be pulled back a minimum of 25' from the road.
5. Stump height may not exceed 10".

7. All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply.
