Resolution offered by the Labor Relations Employee Services Committee.

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Oneida County, Wisconsin:

WHEREAS, the Labor Relations Employee Services Committee (hereinafter LRES Committee), has reviewed the wage schedules for all general municipal employees for calendar year 2016 and the CPIU increase of .73%, as prepared by the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission; and

WHEREAS, the wage increase set forth below has been recommended by the LRES Committee and included in the 2016 approved budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida County Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the adjustments for calendar year 2016 based upon what has been recommended by the LRES Committee; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the general municipal employees shall receive the following:

Exempt and Non-exempt wage schedules shall include an increase of .73% to the control point (Step 6) with all other steps to be calculated based on such increase effective January 2, 2016.
