3 **RESOLUTION #84 - 2009**

4 **Resolution offered by Supervisors of the Land and Water Conservation Committee**

5 **Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Oneida County, Wisconsin:**

7 **WHEREAS**, the Land and Water Conservation Committee has requested that the
8 regular full-time Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Coordinator position, which was originally
9 created and placed at grade level 11 on the Courthouse Association wage schedule as of
10 January 3, 2007, be continued, and

11
12 **WHEREAS**, the original resolution (#86-2006) stated the Aquatic Invasive Species
13 Coordinator position would be reevaluated after three years.

14
15 **WHEREAS**, non-native aquatic invasive species have become and continue to be
16 a resource concern as there are 1,127 lakes in the county, some of which are already
17 infested with aquatic invasive species, and

18
19 **WHEREAS**, the main duty of the position will be to coordinate a county-wide
20 program to control and combat the further spread of non-native aquatic invasive species,
21 and

22 **WHEREAS**, the AIS Coordinator will seek grant funds that are available from DNR
23 or other grant sources for Aquatic Invasive Species education, prevention, and control, and

24
25 **WHEREAS**, the county needs to organize a strategic planning effort to identify
26 prevention and control techniques for combating the spread of aquatic invasive species in
27 the county, and

28
29 **WHEREAS**, the membership of the Oneida County Lakes and Rivers Association
30 strongly supports the need for and creation of an AIS Coordinator, and

31
32 **WHEREAS**, the county needs to develop and implement a strategic plan on
33 aquatic invasive species in cooperation with partner agencies, town governments, lake
34 associations/districts, and other concerned citizens, and

35
36 **WHEREAS**, an information and education program must be developed to educate
37 lake owners, users, government agencies and the general public on aquatic invasive
38 species, and

39
40 **WHEREAS**, recreation and tourism dollars heavily contribute to the economy of
41 the county and loss of quality fishable and swimmable lakes would affect not only our
42 natural resources but also the economy, and

43
44 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Oneida County Board of
45 Supervisors that effective September 23, 2009 the full-time AIS Coordinator position shall
46 be continued at grade level 11 on the Courthouse Association wage schedule.
